HONORARY life membership was given to long-time Goulburn Classic Car Club member Bruce Lambert at the organisation's recent annual general meeting.

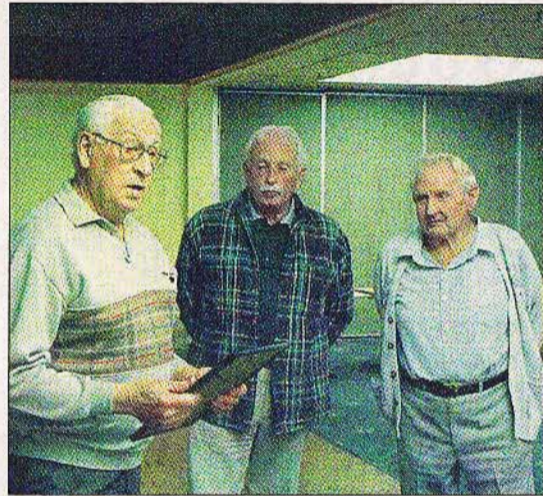
