



Whilst a few things have been suspended due to the Coronavirus, the Committee has been in contact with each other in an effort to stay on top of some Club concerns.

Club Display Day

- Trophies are to be awarded for the CLUB Car of the Day, best 48-215 (sedan), best FJ (sedan), best Commercial vehicle and best Visitor vehicle. There was discussion on whether the Car of the Day was to be a Club vehicle or could be a visitor vehicle as some of the Clubs paperwork was showing it could be either one. No more confusion, it will be CLUB Car of the Day with the Club's material now updated
- Voting box for trophy winners is under the control of the President or his nominated Committee representative
- Counting of the votes is to be conducted by the President or his nominated representative with one or more of the Committee members present
- Cannot vote for your own vehicle
- In the case of a draw, vehicles will be judged by the President and one other Committee member. The vehicle exhibiting the most original features will be considered winner e.g. electrics, engine, trim etc. If there is no clear winner, two trophies are to be are to be awarded
- Results at to be recorded at the Committee meeting following the Display Day

Club Car

- The vehicle must meet eligibility rules outlined in the Clubs HVS Rules and Regulations
- Club member with a vehicle on RMS registration
- Club member with a vehicle on HVS registration, supported by the 48 & FJ Holden Owners Club of NSW Inc.

Visitor / Visiting Car (non Club car)

- Club member with an unregistered car
- Club member with a vehicle on HVS registration, supported by another Club
- Visitor to the Club whose car is registered or unregistered (non-member of the 48 & FJ Holden Owners Club of NSW Inc.)

Display Days (non Club vehicle)

- Open by invitation (subject to Committee approval)
- Vehicle must be representative of its time
- Vehicle of interest or historical value

Cancellation of All Holden Day Notice

Due to Government Guidelines concerning large crowds, events and gatherings, we have had to reschedule the date of the 35th NSW All Holden Day Weekend Event.

As yet the Australian Government and World Health Organisation have not set a future date for the commencement of group gatherings. We envision that when this does recommence it will start with small gatherings, and slowly increase to larger crowds.

As the NSW All Holden Day Event has attracted over 10,000 people for the last few years, we have been advised that events this large will not be able to go ahead in the next few months. 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Fitting a Bosch generator to a 48 with a Delco Remy System By Allan Forbes

Hello hoping every body is well and obeying the rules its a mean virus and I've still to catch up with the club. I am siting around until we are allowed out so we can go for a drive, been out shed fiddling with the 50 ute and found some notes i made quite a few years ago about fitting a Bosch generator to a 48 with a Delco Remy System, as they mount the same its straight forward there. Adjust belt to have 1/2 inch flex in belt when pressed downward between water pump and generator with light pressure is fine. Connect wires NOTE that the terminals are different and marked different A on Delco is D+ on Bosch and F on Delco is DF on Bosch. Don't forget to polarize the generator before starting engine by quickly jumping Bat & Gen on a Delco or B+ and D+ on a Bosch with a suitable jump wire, this allows a surge of current through the generator which correctly polarises it . You will find the generator will work fine. if you want to check the Cut Out Relay, Current or Voltage you will require some additional equipment such as in the pics My AVR as shown on my FJ shows 20 amps and 6.8 volts no test in place just for show. I use the diagnostic machine for Engine RPM when setting up a regulator on car. There is a Test & Minor Adjustment of Generator Regulator On Car found in the appropriate service Manual *Caution: since the voltage regulator is compensated for temperature the regulator must be tested at operating temperature 150 degrees F very hot to touch and it also allows a higher voltage when cold and cold battery.

Just a taste of old technology a snippet from the service manual [the resulting loss of magnetism permits the spring to pull the armature away away from the core and close the upper contact points again, thereby directly grounding generator field so that the generator voltage and current increases This cycle of operation is repeated 100 to 250 times a Second], amazing stuff goes on in the old girls.

If overhauling your Generator i use a 6203 c3 sealed spec bearing still running one in FJ that I o/hauled in 1992. it will fail now I can feel it.

i have a pair of STD finned heavy duty front brake drums to fit to the 50 series ute I believe rare as hens teeth and waiting for Frank to make some new rear ones i have already been supplied two new axles from him.

Also a big thanks to the club more so Kris & Jeff Magnoli for organising pick up and postage to me in Echuca.


